## Être and presentations



Why this?	Introduction to social greetings, being able to say how you are feeling and who you are. Mostly using the verb être Oracy: Aim of raising confidence in speaking another language in front of peers, hearing and using new phonics.

## Family



Why this?	Family is a building block in social interaction, talking about oneself and family (or imaginary family) is natural and motivating.
Why now? What are we building on?	Talking about family introduces a second essential verb: <i>avoir</i> (to have). It strengthens the use of <i>être</i> from term 1a Many students like to talk about their <b>pets</b> as members of their <b>family</b> Those who learned French in primary school will revisit basic vocabulary
